

Leaders Notes for Carol Service CRS1

We hope you will find the service useful and inspiring.

It is intended that churches print off the service orders and then give one per person for the service itself. The file is a PDF format, which you can send to your computer printer. The Carols and Bible readings are ordered like this because the service worked well. There is no theological reason to order them in this way.

The Bible readings are best delivered by one reader for each reading, ensuring many take part in the service. The welcome at the beginning is best said by a leader from the host church, as is the Benediction at the end. Growing churches tend to be those who involve all the members!

Please feel free to add items (offertory collection, homily etc) as your local circumstances dictate.

We suggest you print off some of the posters advertising your service. You'll need to print off one, then add your church's name, address and the date and time of the service. Then, using that as the master, photocopy as many posters as you need. Distribute these to local shops, notice boards etc to publicise your carol service.

Do the same for the Handbills, which can be delivered by hand to homes in your locality. This can be combined with door to door carol singing. This can be part of your church's evangelical effort.

You are free to use this material: we are happy if in some small way we can help you with your ministry. What we cannot do is give permissions which are not ours to give: only you can decide how and if the public performance and or copyright laws affect your circumstances. Every church has to deal with this and we are assuming that your church already has the appropriate mechanisms in place. In very general terms if your church sings hymns and these carols from its own service books, and if your music leaders have paid the appropriate fees to the church music copyright authorities of your country then this will be adequate. However, do check that this is in order.
